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
Safeguarding Cultural Heritage from Disasters, Extreme Weather Events, and Complex Emergencies

October 2024 - October 2027

Introduction: A Call to Action

Europe's cultural heritage – historic sites, artefacts, and traditions— is increasingly threatened by natural hazards, extreme weather events, and conflicts. Devastating floods, wildfires, severe storms and prolonged heatwaves, exacerbated by climate change, are expected to grow in both frequency and magnitude, posing unprecedented challenges to communities and their cultural heritage.

In response to these growing challenges, ICCROM's flagship programme, First Aid and Resilience for Cultural Heritage in Times of Crisis (FAR), in partnership with the European Commission's Directorate-General for Education, Youth, Sport and Culture (DG EAC) with the financial support of the Creative Europe Programme of the European Union, has launched a 38-month pan-European initiative: READY – Safeguarding Cultural Heritage from Disasters, Extreme Weather Events, and Complex Emergencies. This capacity-building project aims to enhance the skills and strategies needed to protect cultural heritage while empowering communities to respond effectively to climate risks, disasters, and complex emergencies.



Why READY?

READY aims to integrate heritage protection into disaster risk management to protect heritage places and their associated communities. By the end of its 38-month implementation, READY will have:

- Trained 60-75 professionals through two in-depth capacity development programs on movable, immovable, and intangible heritage.
- Created a sustainable network of 20-25 trainers, enabling long-term knowledge transfer and capacity building across Europe.
- Implemented 15-20 field projects, focusing on disaster preparedness, emergency response, and community-based risk reduction in participating countries.
- Share good practices, success stories and lessons learned through an online conference and an open-access digital publication to inform policy and practice at a regional and national level.

How READY Works

READY is structured around three interconnected components:

Comprehensive Training Programs

- Two capacity-building initiatives focusing on movable, immovable and intangible heritage.
- Online mentoring paired with immersive, hands-on training.
- Simulation exercises to ensure participants can apply their skills in real-world scenarios.

Field Projects and Knowledge Sharing

- Participants will implement field projects in their home countries, applying the skills learned during training to address local challenges.
- These projects will document traditional knowledge, develop disaster risk management strategies, and enhance community resilience.

Policy Advocacy and Networking

- READY will connect cultural heritage professionals, disaster risk specialists, emergency responders, and policymakers, fostering collaboration across sectors.
- The project will actively promote integrating cultural heritage protection into broader resilience frameworks at the national and EU levels.
